Traineeships

A traineeship is a skills development programme that includes a work placement. It can last from 6 weeks up to 1 year, though most traineeships last for less than 6 months. Employers can receive £1,000 for hosting a traineeship work placement (up to £10,000 per employer available). Each traineeship can be designed with individual employers or for sectors e.g. hospitality, social care etc.

Traineeships help 16 to 24 year olds - or 25 year olds with an education, health and care (EHC) plan - get ready for an apprenticeship or job if they don't have the appropriate skills or experience.

Who can apply: you can apply for a traineeship if you're:

- eligible to work in England
- have little or no work experience but are motivated to work
- aged 16 to 24 - or 25 with an EHC plan - and qualified up to [level 3](#)
