COVID Catch-Up Premium 2020-2021

Total funding allocation for 2020 – 2021 is £98,640.

Redruth School will use the additional funding to meet the following expectations:

1. Teach an ambitious and broad curriculum in all subjects from the start of the autumn term. Subjects will contribute to the filling of gaps in core knowledge
2. Curriculum planning will be informed by an assessment of pupils' starting points and addressing the gaps in their knowledge and skills
3. Develop remote education so that it is integrated into the School Curriculum Plan

The school will be using the EEF 3 tiered guidance approach which is:

1. Teaching
 - a. High quality teaching for all
 - b. Effective assessment
 - c. Support remote learning
 - d. Professional development
2. Targeted academic support
 - a. 1 to 1 and small group tuition
 - b. Teaching assistants
 - c. Academic tutoring
 - d. Planning for pupils with SEND
3. Wider strategies
 - a. Supporting pupils' social, behavioural and emotional needs
 - b. Communicating and supporting parents
 - c. Planning for a social and emotional learning curriculum

Enhanced Support Centre (ESC)	£22,508 (50% M5)	The Enhanced Support Centre (ESC) provides behaviour support and intervention for some of our most vulnerable/ difficult students in KS4. Pastoral Lead	£14,846 (H1 7/12 months)	The school is appointing an additional pastoral lead to support the emotional and behavioural needs across the school. Their role is varied but includes sorting any issues within a year group including, safeguarding, attendance, behaviour, improve links with parents and outside agencies, bullying, and mentoring students. Remote Learning	£5,920	Ensure that the Satchel One platform is rolled out successfully and enables usage across all year groups	Satchel will allow for strong, independent learning at home. Lexonik Assessments	£4,000	School have purchased the Lexonik assessment in addition to our Sound Training licence and have had 5 staff trained in delivering this programme. Computers	£6,000	Ensure all students in all years have access to the internet and a computer at home	This will allow students to access online learning resources at home, whether for homework, periods of isolation or local lockdown events	Student engagement in learning at home
