Congratulations to Jago Mottart, Year 10, who has recently returned from an 8 day dance intensive in Southern Italy where he has been taught by some of the world's finest teachers and choreographers in hip hop, commercial and contemporary dance.

Jago was awarded the free place at TD Italy after he was spotted at Shine dance competition in July by Ricky Jinks of Untitled Dance Company. Whilst in Italy Jago took every advantage of the situation, often taking eight classes per day over the eight day period.

A highlight for Jago included being selected by Brian Friedman (X Factor, I'm a Celeb fame) to perform his choreography in front of the other 200 dancers. Jago's ability and work ethic whilst on the dance intensive resulted in him being offered a second scholarship place on TD Italy 2018 by the organisers at the end of the event.

Jago is now preparing to juggle his dance and school life once again as he begins a second term as part of Got To Dance winner Lukas McFarlane's SEEDs company, which is made up of some of the best young dancers across the UK.

Jago trains with Lukas every weekend in London, on a free scholarship basis, leading towards a final production in Central London in December.
