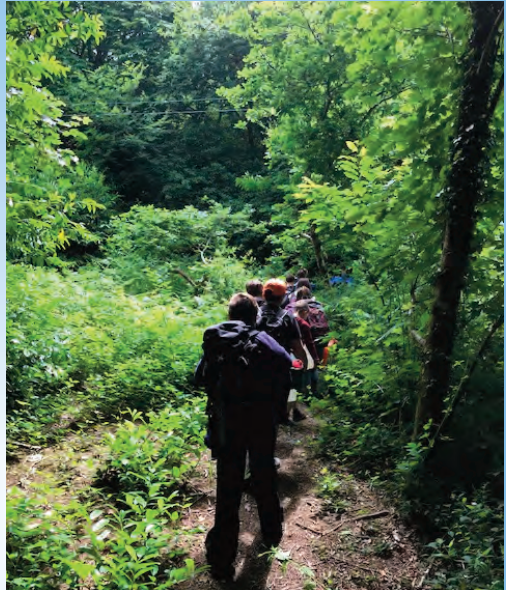
Outdoor Learning

Redruth Outdoor Learning students had a change of scenery this week with a trip to Tehidy woods.

As part of their lessons students are working towards the John Muir Award, a national environmental award which encourages people to connect with, enjoy and care for wild places. To develop the Discover and Explore sections of their award, our students went to Tehidy woods to compare it to our small woodland on site.
