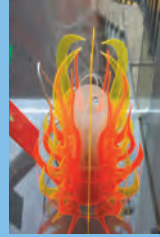

Portreath Surf Life Saving



Redruth School students representing Portreath SLSC have had a very busy and successful British Championships at Holywell Bay.

In the Youth Championships Harry Larkins achieved 2nd U15 Ironman and 3rd U15 Board. Morgan Larkins came 1st U15 Beach Flags. Darragh Boyd achieved 2nd U15 Beach Sprint and 2nd U15 Beach Flags. Harry, Morgan and Darragh also picked up medals in the relay and pair events, proving to be a strong trio in this age group. Piran Phillips running with a broken hand won the U17 1k run.

In the Nipper Championships Hayden Phillips picked up a Gold medal in the Board Rescue and teamed up with Joseph Clifton-Griffith in the surf relay for a Silver medal.

In the Open National Championships Piran Phillips became the youngest ever competitor to win a National Open title, winning the 2k Beach Run.

Many other Redruth School students picked up valuable points to help the overall point scores with Portreath SLSC winning the overall Super Club title for 2018!
