Remembrance

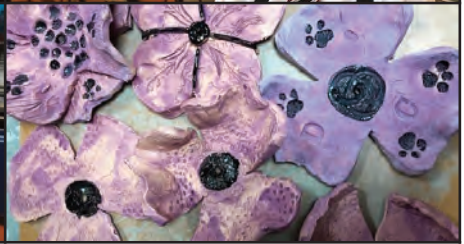
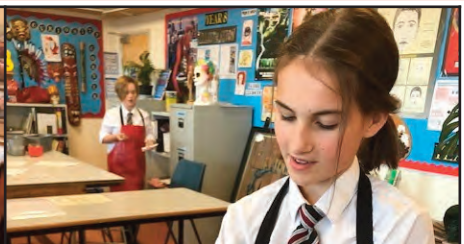
The whole school observed 2 minutes silence on Monday for Remembrance Day.
